We hopped right into April making polka dot bunnies for Easter! The children decorated their Easter bags. Each child loved going on the egg hunt to find treats. We gave them each a set of bunny ears and we had fun doing the "bunny pokey". At our Easter/Spring party the children painted paper eggs with roller balls and ate delicious cupcakes.

Now that spring has sprung, we took the snowflakes off our classroom tree and made beautiful watercolor flowers to replace the snow. We talked about how all the brown trees would start to bloom with flowers and leaves now that it was springtime. We read *Hamilton Duck*. It's a story about a duck that is so excited for spring. He takes a nap to wake up and find pink blossoms falling on his head. He thinks it's snow and is so sad. Then he realizes that it's not snow that's falling, but flower blossoms.

We talked about Earth Day and how to keep the earth clean by picking up your trash and throwing it in the trash can. We also talked about reusing different items such as the plastic water bottles we used to make the sensory bottles. They really loved adding their sparkles, glitter, rocks, and color to these bottles. Each child was so excited with their creation. We read some different books about where trash goes after it leaves the house, how to keep the beaches and parks clean, and to use shopping bags when going to the store. They had a lot to contribute about saving the earth! It was a great discussion!

Next, we moved on to Humpty Dumpty. They love the story of Humpty and help me tell it using the flannel board. I brought some eggs from home and drew Humpty faces on them. We built a wall and told the story to find out what exactly happened to Humpty when he fell. Miss Kim was able to "bandage" Humpty back together again when he fell off a low wall, but as it got taller, well Humpty didn't stand a chance! They loved making the wall taller and taller to see what would happen. We also had a surprise visit from Miss Stephanie's chicken, "Fuzzy". She brought "Fuzzy" into our class, we learned she was a hen, and heard her make all sorts of funny chicken noises! "Fuzzy" even let us pet her! What a fun surprise!
